Out theme for November was "Remembering".



One day he had become a powerful governor.


At a time of famine his brothers unknowingly came to their brother Joseph for help.

We would love you to write a prayer, or to draw a picture about our Messy Church activities, that we can put in our Messy Church Newsletter.



It's not a person I am talking about this month.

We hold our monthly Messy Churches at our Church, St James the Great.

St James was built in 1831, as part of the Parish of Solihull. In 1843 Shirley became a parish in its own right.

We have some lovely Victorian stained glass windows that tell Bible stories to us.

It has a simple stone font used for baptisms, some of which have taken place during Messy Church.

The graveyard has 23 war graves and a war memorial, where we remember those who died during our remembrance parade in November

Its a beautiful, historical building. But, more recently we have had a disabled toilet and kitchenette installed.

Those who were at November's Messy Church will also have felt the benefit of those cleverly designed heating chandeliers.
