Books that last

There's a line in a Seamus Heaney poem ('Postscript') that we might conjure up to sum up what books have done to and for us. He talks about how there are moments in our lives that 'catch the heart off guard and blow it open'. Books provide those moments for all of us in the Book Club.

So, we have taken on two short projects to begin 2026. The first to read any Roald Dahl book. The second to tell the rest of the group about any book that caught our heart when we were younger – as children or as parents and grandparents.


The Roald Dahl books were: *The Magic Finger*, *Matilda*, *Love From Boy: Roald Dahl's Letters to His Mother*, *Danny the Champion of the World* and *The Giraffe, the Pelly and Me*. All of these books evoke memories of the past – particularly of reading to our children and grandchildren. Each book is often beautiful, invariably funny, but most of all none of them are sentimental. Many of the adults in the books are cruel, school is often brutal, yet the central young characters are clever and perceptive. We agreed that all of Dahl's books are dark and yet at the same time, delightful.

From talk of Roald Dahl, we went on to give the titles of some books that, in earlier years, had the power to 'catch the heart and blow it open'. Once we started on our lists, it became hard to stop.

The books: *The Cluck and Master Quack* (long since out of print) Edited by Annette Mills; *Little Women* Louise May Alcott; *What Katy Did* Susan Coolidge; All of the Narnia books C.S. Lewis; *A Wayne in a Manager* Gervais Finn; *Heard it in the playground* Poems by Alan Ahlberg; *The Thirty Nine Steps* John Buchan.


We found it difficult to stop talking once we started!

BIBLE STUDY MORNING

‘AN INTRODUCTION TO MATTHEW’S GOSPEL’

Saturday 31st January, 10am – 11.30am in Church House

Having had to postpone due to the weather, the new date for this Bible study morning will be Saturday 31st January.

You may know that the Church of England’s lectionary follows a three-year cycle, focusing in turn on the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, with John interspersed at key points. This year, our readings focus mainly on Matthew.

Matthew’s Gospel is carefully structured and richly layered. It has provided a strong foundation for the Church’s teaching on Jesus, the Kingdom of Heaven, and the Christian life. During our study morning, we will *lift the lid* on this Gospel, exploring questions such as: Who was Matthew? When and why was the Gospel written? What are its main themes, and how have they shaped the history of the Church and continue to speak to us today?

Whether you are new to exploring Matthew’s Gospel or already familiar with it, I hope that there will be something for everyone. We all know more of Matthew than we might realise, and this session will be a chance to deepen that understanding together.

The only requirement is to bring a Bible with you - not a phone or electronic device - and to come with an open mind, ready to think, learn, and be challenged. Refreshments will be served, and if you have any questions beforehand, please feel free to ask me.

SHOCKING ECO FACTS

Did you watch the Dr Who spin-off film over Christmas, called “The War Between the Land and the Sea”? I am not a science-fiction fan, but this film is one that everyone should watch. It is about an ancient species, Homo Aqua, forced to emerge from the sea to confront humans about all the plastics, oil, excrement, poison dumped there by humans and making it impossible for them to live at the bottom of the ocean. When the human response is not forthcoming, they decide to return what humans have dumped in the seas to the land. We see unimaginable quantities of plastics and other rubbish literally raining down - a plastics flood - over the whole world and an international emergency is declared!

Recently, Kate and John, Ray and I attended a talk at the Stratford upon Avon Autumn Literary Festival. We chose to attend a talk given by journalist, Saabira Chaudhuri, and criminal psychologist, Dr. Julia Shaw. Their talk focused on the way in which profit-obsessed global companies have hood-winked us into a reliance on disposable, often single-use, plastics and plastic-wrapped ultra-processed foods like ready meals. They asked how plastic could have taken over our lives and why we had been unable to rein it in. Dr. Shaw touched on some of the worst environmental “green” crimes of our time. It was shocking to realise that companies will claim recyclable disposability of their packaging / cups / etc. when in fact they are deceiving us. The talk made everyone present aware that we need to take responsibility for what we buy and what we believe of the manufacturers’ claims.

“While at first we shaped plastic, somewhere along the way plastic took over and began shaping us.” Saabira Chaudhuri.

From a book by Chaudhuri ...

Shocking fact number 1:

Many plastics are made using additives that can leach into food and drinks. Tiny particles of plastic have been found in everything from foetuses to the human brain, with a knock-on effect on health as well as biodiversity and the ocean’s ability to act as a carbon sink.

Shocking fact number 2:

Globally, just 9% of all plastic waste ever created has been recycled. Most plastics are uneconomical to recycle.

Shocking fact number 3:

The equivalent of one dustcart of plastic waste ends up in the ocean every minute.

From the talk at the literary festival, I took away the determination to buy food using the LOAF philosophy as one small step towards minimising our carbon footprint on God’s earth and seas - and to scrutinise packaging of goods beyond food before I commit to buy. I hope you will too.

At the end of "The War Between the Land and the Sea", the head of UNIT (originally from Doctor Who, the Unified Intelligence Taskforce), is walking along a beach when she comes across a runner who drops his empty plastic water bottle.

"Pick that up", she commands sternly. He refuses several times. The programme finishes as she produces a gun and points it at him.

"Pick it up", she shouts. We assume that he did pick it up!




As part of this, we're offering a series of Lent Conversations each week. You're welcome to come to whichever time suits you best:


7.30pm on Wednesday evenings: 25th February, 4th March, 11th March, 18th March, 25th March

Candlemas comes exactly forty days after Christmas. In New Testament times forty days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child - to 'present Him to the Lord'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Luke 2: 22-40). So where does the Candlemas bit come in? Jesus is described in the New Testament as the Light of the World, and early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this day.
