Messy Church in January


Our theme in January was Saul's conversion to Christianity and methods of communication.

Saul was blinded, so he was led into Damascus by hand.


Jesus spoke to his follower Ananias, and asked him to approach Saul. Ananias was reluctant as he had heard of this unpleasant man.
