PEARLS BEFORE POPPIES

The synopsis of the October Mothers' Union meeting told us about Mary Bodfish's excellent talk 'Lest We Forget': obviously the word 'poppies' cropped up and since then they have been seen in numerous ways for Remembrance in November, not least our own wonderful display cascading down the wall outside St James Church. Also in the talk, however, there was mention of a mobile ambulance unit run by the British Red Cross and that prompted me to tell you about another, possibly less well-known, story for Remembrance.

Following the outbreak of war in 1914, the Red Cross had formed the Joint War Committee with the Order of St John of Jerusalem. They worked together and pooled their fundraising and resources for the duration of the war but at the beginning of 1918 and no end to the war insight funds were low. Hospitals at home and abroad needed staff and equipment; the women and men who were not serving in that sphere either abroad or at home were stoically raising funds by holding bazaars, flag days, concerts or simply donating what they could afford. However, the need for more funds was becoming critical.

As a result of this Lady Northcliffe (Mary, known as Mollie) wife of Lord Northcliffe (Alfred Harmsworth) conceived the idea to raise funds using her husband's newspapers *The Times* and the *Daily Mail*. She ran a campaign to collect enough pearls to create a necklace, to be raffled to raise money for the British Red Cross.

First published in hardback in 2018, *Pearls Before Poppies: The Story of The Red Cross Pearls* by Rachel Trethewey, is fully indexed and contains some beautiful photographs.

What began as a high-society campaign captured the wider public's imagination. Her husband's success relied on his newspapers reaching all sections of society, not just a limited elite. Women everywhere donated pearls in tribute to those they had lost, while groups of women raised enough to contribute one pearl on behalf of their communities. Over 4,000 pearls came in from around the world, enough to create forty-one separate strings. No spoilers here, you need to read the chapter *The Pearl Necklace Auction* to know the final amount of money raised.

There are 16 chapters in all, 236 pages, drawing on material from various archives other than the Red Cross, many particularly from family archives, heirlooms and descendants of the families involved. This story is extensively researched, wonderfully told, informative, amusing, poignant and deeply touching. It embraces all aspects of society, communities, faith, loss and hope as it was in that memorable period of the First World War. Perhaps the ethos is best summed up by the quote on the end cover, with acknowledgements to Rachel Trethewey.

"It is not a perfect pearl, but it is the only one I have. I send it in memory of a pearl beyond all price already given, my only son, and I feel that perhaps one pearl in that great historic necklace from me may hang side by side with those of greater beauty, even as mothers of only sons stand side by side with those who, richer, could give more". Edith Fielden, 21 April 1918.

I understood a bit more about Open the Book but one thing still confused me. When we arrived we parked in an empty car park but as far away from the way into the school as was possible. It was raining so I could not fathom why we had not parked nearer the gate. As we left it was the end of school time. The car park was now very full and people



were driving round looking for spaces. But we were able to drive straight out. Perhaps I should have more faith that they do know what they are doing!

CHRISTMAS UNWRAPPED!

All of us have received unwanted gifts at Christmas. For Joseph the gift of a child, as recorded in Matthew Chapter 1, was not something he really wanted. Although he was engaged to Mary, her pregnancy would be grounds for divorce. Not surprisingly, with the associated social disgrace, Joseph wanted to divorce Mary quietly (Matthew 1:19). However, God intervened in a dream: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call Him Immanuel, which means, God with us.' (1:23). In a scary and uncertain world, what does the message of **Immanuel** say to us today?

God is present with us

God assured Joseph that He was working in all that Joseph was going through. The eternal and creator God entered time and space as a baby. This baby is both uniquely divine but also fully human. This means that we can know God personally, not just know about Him. The Holy Spirit is committed to making Jesus' life and character real in us, and bringing meaning to our circumstances, just as He worked in Mary's life.

God is on our side

Christmas touches some raw nerves in our lives, including stress, family rows, loneliness and financial pressures. However, God does not remain aloof from our experiences. In Jesus He enters our world of hopes and fears, joys and disappointments. He understands what we are going through, as He is alongside us. By the cross and resurrection, He gave His life that we might know His love, joy, peace and forgiveness.

For Joseph, as well as us, the Christmas message is one of hope in an uncertain world. It is a time to re-consider the claims of *Immanuel* ('God with us') as we entrust ourselves to Him for the coming year.

Even before the time of Christ, evergreen trees were seen in winter as a symbol of fertility.

It was the 16th century monk, Martin Luther, who is credited with the idea of having lights on Christmas trees. He added candles to his tree, to look like stars in a forest.

Windsor Castle got its first Christmas tree in 1800, brought by Charlotte, wife of George III.

It was in 1835 that the term 'Christmas tree' was first used in English.

It was in the 1840s, when Prince Albert, consort of Queen Victoria, began bringing trees inside, that led to their popularity throughout the UK.




