The Book Club had a choice of three books this time, everyone read at least one of these books and their thoughts are as follows:

The Fortnight in September – R C Sherriff

‘This book about nothing turns out to be about everything.’ A beautiful book, one that you would want to keep and read again. The book is just about a fortnights holiday. Those who read it talked about the characters and how well described they were and endearing. It also shows you how much life has changed. The characters were very accepting of everything. All who read this really loved it, and thought it was a delightful read.

The Island of Missing Trees – Elif Shafak

Another lovely story, this time based on the troubles in Cyprus, a love story encompassed with sadness and war. The social commentary on the times is provided in the voice of the Fig Tree that features heavily in the story. There is a lot of information about the times described by the tree, and it helps to understand what was going on in Cyprus. There are happy times and sad times in the book, and it is very cleverly tied together, flicking between Cyprus in the 1970s and London in the 2010s. Again, all who read this enjoyed it.

Restoration – Rose Tremain

This is an historical novel, based on the time of Charles 2nd, a man who goes through life making the wrong choices and is a bit of a buffoon. He ends up in a big house married to the mistress of the King, arranged by the King as a cover up. The man has feelings for the mistress, but it goes sour and he loses everything. He ends up living in Norfolk with a friend who runs an asylum. He helps a female patient and discovers he can soothe her, she develops feelings for him, and his life falls apart again.... All those who read this book really enjoyed it.

We swapped the books between us for those who fancied an extra book over the Christmas period before we meet again.

Our next choice is an interesting one, we are tasked to find a children’s book that has a significant memory for us, whether we read it as a child or had it read to us, or whether we have read it to our children or grandchildren. Then to think about how it made us feel and share with the group.

REVEREND JULIE HUMPHRIES R.I.P.

Reverend Julie Humphries, whose funeral took place on 24th November 2025, was from 2012 – 2017 a Team Vicar in Shirley Parish; initially when Fr Michael Caddy was Rector and later during the time of Fr. Peter Law-Jones.

I first met Julie at The Queen's Foundation Edgbaston, while she was training for ordained ministry. We were often sitting next to each other at the college evening dinner and discovered that we both came from Worcester Diocese. Julie completed her training and served her Title as Curate in Redditch Holy Trinity, which included St Leonard's Beoley; St Philip's Webheath and St Stephen's Redditch. The Rector at the time was Reverend Canon David Rogers and Julie and her husband Mick, remained friends with David until he died.

In 2012 Fr. Michael asked if I knew anyone who would be interested in applying for the post of Team Vicar in Shirley Parish with responsibility for St Patrick's and St John's. I mentioned Julie and he asked me to contact her, which I did. Julie told me she had already applied for the post and felt her decision to do so affirmed. I recall, at that time, another Curate from Redditch parish telling me that they didn't know how hard Julie worked until she left.

Throughout her time in Shirley Parish, I observed that Julie was always a dedicated priest who was thoroughly well prepared for whatever her ministry entailed. Speaking recently to one of the parishioners I was told how she always found Julie's ministry at St John's sincere and heartwarming and how she spoke passionately and with commitment. Another commented on Julie's enthusiasm for 'Open the Book', a legacy which continues to this day, sharing Bible stories with children in local schools. Apart from her usual ministerial responsibilities Julie found time to take part in 'Journey to the Stable' at St James, which ministers in Advent to hundreds of pupils from surrounding schools. I found Julie to have a lively and cheerful personality coupled with a keen sense of fairness.

There were many challenging times for Julie during her ministry and a major step was leading St Patrick's through a transition period to become a separate parish. Her ministry continued for a further two years as Vicar of St Patrick's and she left in 2019. When Julie left Birmingham, she returned to ministry in Worcester Diocese. Julie will be sadly missed by many who knew her. She died surrounded by her family on 31st October 2025. May she rest in peace and rise in glory.

NEW HEATING IN ST JAMES CHURCH

There is now an even warmer welcome than usual at St James's Church!

We have just replaced our 35 year old gas boilers with electric heating chandeliers and panels. We now no longer use fossil fuels to heat our buildings.

The chandeliers were supplied and installed by Electric Heating Solutions, who pioneered this form of heating for churches over 12 years ago in Kings Lynn Minster and, as well as being very effective, they look beautiful in our grade 2 listed Victorian church.

We are a Demonstrator parish and our local fundraising was matched by a grant from the Demonstrator Project (funded by the Benefact Trust and the Archbishops' Council Net Zero Carbon Programme). We will be evaluating our project closely and will be very glad to share our experiences with anyone looking at solutions for a cold, dark church.

This has been a big team effort with so many people contributing ideas, advice, donations, expertise and support. Thanks to you all for making the project happen.

TANZANIA DELICIOUS CASHEWS

Here in Shirley Parish, we are 'going for gold' following on from our successful efforts to gain silver standard as an Eco church. One of the requirements is to engage with events globally, and our PCC has chosen to support financially Tanzania Delicious Cashews. The mission of the organisation is to build the industry for the benefit of the local community, local processors, workers and farmers and their families, and to bring sustainable development to the Makonde Plateau in Tanzania.

The company is 100% locally owned and sources cashews only from the Makonde Plateau; they count among the best cashews in the world. They are grown traditionally by farming families with long experience of producing this crop. TDC was founded in 2020 by local farmers; seven women and one man. This is a woman led company that fights hard to reduce poverty and create better living conditions for farmers and other workers families.

The chairperson, one of the Executive Directors, Finance Director, Head of Production and Quality Manager are all women; the other Executive Director and the Operations Director are men. As a result of their success the company is currently constructing a new factory building.

The director general of the World Trade Organisation, Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala, says that the surest way for Africa to lift itself out of poverty is to grow its economies and create jobs.

Tanzania Delicious Cashews is doing just that.

BIBLE STUDY MORNING ‘AN INTRODUCTION TO MATTHEW’S GOSPEL’

Saturday 10th January, 10am – 11.30am in Church House

On Saturday 10th January, I will be leading a Bible study session on the Gospel according to St Matthew, and everyone is warmly invited to attend.

You may know that the Church of England’s lectionary follows a three-year cycle, focusing in turn on the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, with John interspersed at key points. This year, our readings focus mainly on Matthew.

Matthew’s Gospel is carefully structured and richly layered. It has provided a strong foundation for the Church’s teaching on Jesus, the Kingdom of Heaven, and the Christian life. During our study morning, we will *lift the lid* on this Gospel, exploring questions such as: Who was Matthew? When and why was the Gospel written? What are its main themes, and how have they shaped the history of the Church and continue to speak to us today?

Whether you are new to exploring Matthew’s Gospel or already familiar with it, I hope that there will be something for everyone. We all know more of Matthew than we might realise, and this session will be a chance to deepen that understanding together.



The only requirement is to bring a Bible with you - not a phone or electronic device - and to come with an open mind, ready to think, learn, and be challenged. Refreshments will be served, and if you have any questions beforehand, please feel free to ask me.

EPIPHANY SEASON

The weeks that follow Christmas can sometimes feel like a low point in both church life and daily routine. The decorations come down on Twelfth Night, work and school resume, and January's cold weather can bring a sense of gloom. Yet the church season of Epiphany is anything but gloomy. Far from being an anticlimax to Christmas, Epiphany is full of richness and wonder.

The word Epiphany means "manifestation". It celebrates one aspect of the Christmas story: the visit of the far-travelled Magi, understood as the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. But the season extends far beyond this moment. Epiphany invites us to pray for the worldwide mission of the Church. It embraces the Feast of the Conversion of St Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles, and the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. It also recalls Christ's baptism, when the heavens opened and the Father's voice was heard, and the miracle at Cana in Galilee, where water was turned into wine.

Epiphany season concludes with the Feast of the Presentation, also known as Candlemas, in early February. Here Simeon's words in the temple move us from the joy of Christmas towards the deeper mysteries of Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

As in previous years, we will bless chalk, inviting you to mark your homes with the initials of the Magi as a sign of Christ's welcome to all who come visiting.

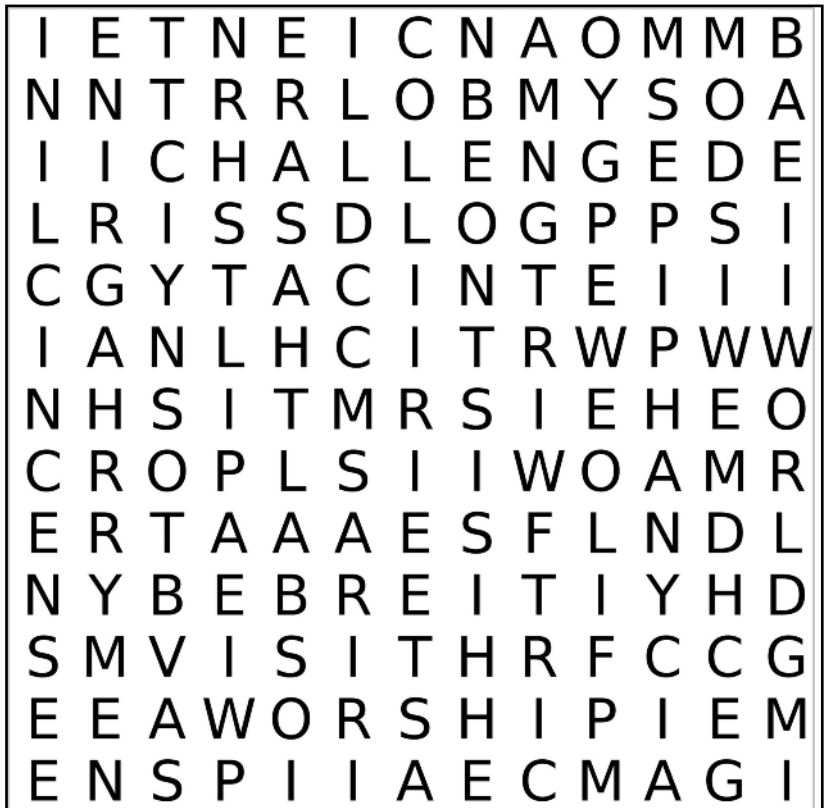

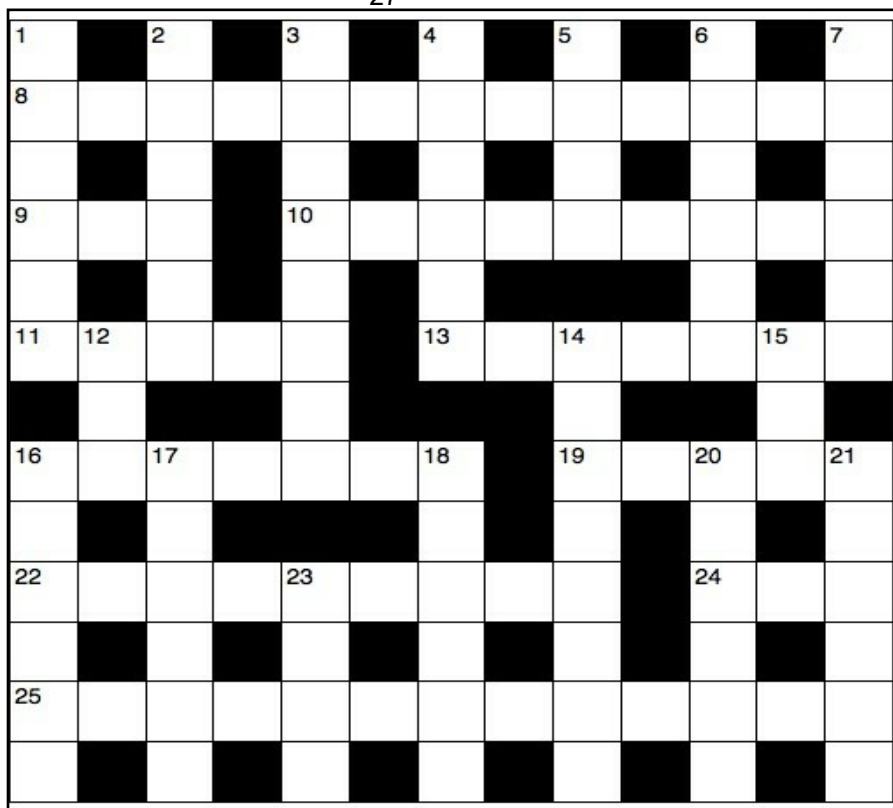

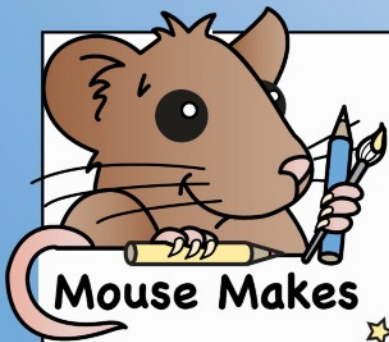

The star was a sign of the birth of a king, so they followed that star to pay homage to him.

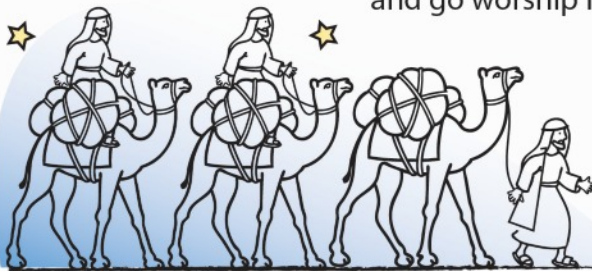
They found him in Bethlehem as the prophets fortold, they gave him three gifts: myrrh, frankincense and gold.
